Chapter 2 contrasts Native American and western ways of identifying effective treatments for mental and physical disorders, concluding that "evidence-informed culture-based" interventions sometimes constitute best practices in Native communities. More than three quarters of the chapters are written by colleagues who also contributed to most or all of the previous editions.
